Funding:

GFO funding is based on projects and partnership with INGOs and sometime gifts and cooperation with private institution.

Since 2007, GFO had good partnership with International communities including UN Agencies, IOM, ICRC and INGOS.

- CHF/SHF. GFO is eligible for CHF/SHF funding since 2011 up to date. Last project was August 2021 Food Security and livelihood project.

- 1- Internally Displaced Person (IDPS) # 1,020,900 individuals received humanitarian services (Food, Non-food and shelters, Health, Water and Sanitation, education and protection since 2006
- 2- Host rural communities who hosted IDPs. # 157,000 households received FSL, training on IGAs, GBV and women empowerment.
- 3- Refugees: 26,000 individuals who received emergency services including reception kits.
